Conferences

Objectives

- To promote the latest research and interdisciplinary work being carried out in the East African Rift.
- Generating and strengthening interaction networks between members of the GDR Rift, GDR countries and conference partners
- Providing a forum for dialogue and exchange for young researchers in the Rift Valley



Achievements

4 symposia: 2020 (Kick-off 2 days in Covid video); 2022 (Lyon, 3 days, scientific); 2023 (Paris, 2 days, general public); 2024 (Narok, Kenya, 5 days, scientific).

Budget & operations

- o Budget managed by the director's UMR (Géosciences Montpellier) for Lyon and Paris,
- o Strong involvement of CNRS Terre et Univers and CNRS Ecologie et Environnement,
- o The Maasaï Mara University, the French Embassy in Kenya, the CFEE and the IFRA will be heavily involved in the organisation of the event in 2024,
- o For each Colloquium, an organising committee was appointed and met to prepare the event in addition to the GDR's scientific committee.



Reflective assessment

- Budgetary priority given to young researchers and GDR member countries through mobility grants,
- Excellent participation from statuary colleagues, researchers, doctoral students and post-doctoral students from the Rift countries,
- Difficulty of the chosen site, which favours the presence of certain nationalities over others,
- Collective reflection on inter-disciplinarity and the challenges of the Rift (e.g. Resources),
- Collective reflection on the organisation of the colloquia (fieldwork, workshops, etc.).

• Kick Off - Video conference - 9-10 November 2020

First conference of the inter-institute project GDR RIFT - Great African Rift in videoconference (cause covid).

Key theme of the conference: *Defining the "Rift" object*, since it is perceived in significantly different ways from one community to another. This symposium provided an opportunity to approach the Rift from an interdisciplinary perspective and to prepare effectively for interactions between the different communities within the Rift research group.

To build this dialogue between disciplines, we have **focused this first meeting on discussions** rather than scientific presentations.

Four workshops based on the GDR's scientific themes provided an opportunity to discuss these definitions, the scientific challenges and the way in which we want to interact together: the Rift's heritage, system dynamics, natural resources, training and education.

Conference, Lyon - 22-24 November 2022



70 participants from France, Democratic Republic of Congo, Tanzania, Ethiopia, Kenya and Djibouti (including 12 students from the Rift Valley countries).
